OMAHA – FOREIGN TRADE ZONE NO.19

From import to export – and everything in between – storing your goods here is a smart move.

If your company is doing business internationally, Omaha's Foreign Trade Zone No.19 gives you a competitive advantage. Located on more than 17 acres of land with 250,000 square feet of warehouse space, our Foreign Trade Zone is a secured area under the supervision of the United States Customs Department.

Defer duty payments on foreign goods brought here until the time they enter U.S. trading channels. There is no time limit on storing, processing, assembling, exhibiting or inspecting the imported goods. And, if the imported goods are later exported, you'll pay no customs duty.

OUR FOREIGN TRADE ZONE LETS YOU DEFER, REDUCE OR ELIMINATE CUSTOMS DUTIES.

Customs Duty Considerations

- You can save up to 85% on the processing/entry fees required by Customs, depending on how often goods are brought in. You pay those charges just once a week, instead of daily.
- Eliminate costly delays in Customs clearances and duty drawbacks.
- Take advantage of duty-free in-bond, zone-to-zone transfer of Foreign Trade Zone merchandise or on goods being re-exported from the Zone.
- Store, return or destroy spare parts without duty payment.
- Sell or auction your goods in the Zone before paying duty or excise tax.
- Allow buyers to sample or inspect goods in the Zone before paying duty.
- Reduce or eliminate duties on substandard, defective, damaged or obsolete goods and materials as well as those materials subject to waste or scrap.

Import / Export Capabilities

- Import goods into the Zone and then re-export those goods without ever paying duty.
- Import your goods in excess of quota and hold them in the Zone until the next quota period. Import quotas do not apply in the Zone.
- Transfer bonded merchandise in excess of quotas to the Zone for Zone Restricted Status, allowing for quicker recovery of duty drawback.

Manipulation Advantages

- Take advantage of permitted manipulation of goods in the Zone. The rate of duty may be lower if your merchandise is disassembled or otherwise changed before entry.
- Re-label or re-mark merchandise in the Zone, avoiding the fine assessed on improperly marked goods reaching Customs territory.
- Assemble and repackage products in the Zone. The rate of duty applied to the finished product entering the United States may be applied either to the finished product itself, or to the foreign material in it.





IN THE MIDDLE OF AMERICA, OMAHA CAN SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER YOUR TRADE COSTS.

Omaha's Foreign Trade Zone No.19 offers distinct logistical advantages that can save your business up to 25% over coastal Zones in time and labor costs. Omaha is an excellent distribution hub. Nearly 18% of all U.S. manufacturers and 20% of the nation's population is within a 500-mile radius of Omaha. The majority of U.S. destinations can be reached in two to three days by truck.

Eppley Airfield, Omaha's major commercial airport, is located five minutes northeast of the downtown area and five minutes from the Trade Zone. In recent years, Eppley has made an investment of more than \$110 million in terminal, apron, cargo areas and runway expansions. And while more than 200 million pounds of cargo passed through the facility in 2004 alone, the field and terminal facilities are far from saturated. The Airfield is currently serviced by eight airfreight carriers.

Foreign Trade Zone No.19 also enjoys convenient overnight access to international gateways including Chicago O'Hare, Minneapolis, Denver and Kansas City International airports.

Strategically located at the intersection of Interstate Highways 80 and 29, you can optimize FTL and LTL transit times, sending to and receiving from most U.S. points within one to three days.

Omaha's central location promotes efficient rail service to destinations across the nation. In fact, the most direct mid-continental railroad route to the West Coast passes on a line from Chicago through Omaha and on to Los Angeles. Omaha's Zone warehouse offers live access to freight recovery locations at the BNSF and Union Pacific Railroad yards.

And, the Omaha area is served by several barge lines via the Missouri River that typically provide water transportation March through November.

OMAHA'S FOREIGN TRADE ZONE WAREHOUSE FACILITY GIVES YOU A REAL-TIME INVENTORY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM WITH SECURE PORTAL ACCESS.


The Foreign Trade Zone facility offers a full range of amenities that make it easy to store, manage and move merchandise, including a unique container-loading platform that works with oversized and hard to pack cargo.

The warehouse is staffed with certified equipment handlers who use lift trucks of various capacities and up to 35,000 pounds of lift capability. Customized programs and pricing accommodate every customer's 3PL needs, and an integrated workshop is available to build customized crates and pallets for exceptional cargo.

The facility is secured by digital cameras on a gated lot with alarm and sprinkler systems, and is attached to a multi-functional office space with up to 10,000 square feet for on-site use by customers.

Other services provided by the Zone operator include:

- Container drayage
- Inventory management
- Distribution
- Devanning and palletization
- Packing and labeling
- Short-term and long-term storage
- Deeply discounted transportation programs with a wide range of carriers
- Other specialized services

Compete more efficiently.

FUNCTION	FOREIGN TRADE ZONE
Customs entry	Customs entry is not required until goods are removed.
Permissible cargo	All merchandise – domestic or foreign.
Customs bonds	No bond required.
Payment of duties	Due only upon entry into U.S. territory.
Manufacture of goods	Permitted with duty payable at the time the goods leave the Zone for U.S. consumption. No duty on waste material or on value-added in manufacturing. No duties paid on export goods.
Appraisal and classification	Tariff rate and value are determined at your discretion, either at the time of admission or when goods leave the Zone.
Storage periods	Unlimited.
Operations on merchandise for domestic consumption	Sort, destroy, clean, grade, mix with foreign or domestic goods, label, assemble, manufacture, exhibit, sell, repack.
Customs entry regulations	Only applies to goods removed for U.S. consumption.
Jurisdiction of other federal agencies	Application of regulations depends on products and agency involved.

If your business has a manufacturing operation that cannot feasibly move to, or be accommodated in, Foreign Trade Zone No. 19, you can seek subzone status for your physical location. In addition to meeting general criteria for the subzone, you would have to demonstrate how the subzone could enhance local economic development objectives. As a subzone, your business would enjoy all the benefits of the Foreign Trade Zone. U.S. Customs must be able to oversee your on-site activities.
